

Medicaid Coverage

Mandatory- State Plan Benefits

 Inpatient and outpatient hospital services, physician services, laboratory and x-ray services, nursing facility services, home health, and more...

Optional Benefits

 Prescription drugs, case management, physical therapy, occupational therapy, mental health services, HCBS and more...





EPSDT Early Periodic Screening Diagnostic & Treatment

- For <u>all</u> children on Medicaid
- Birth <u>up to</u> age 21
- The screening is the <u>first step</u> to
- accessing EPSDT services.
- Provides medically necessary services
- Provides benefits for children above the State Plan benefit



Buy In Program for Children with Disabilities

- You must be a child under the age of 19,
- You must have a qualifying disability. The <u>Social Security</u> <u>Administration (SSA) listings</u> describes what disabilities qualify, and
- Your gross family income after disregards must be below 300% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL). You may have additional income that is disregarded. For example, in 2019, a family of four earning about \$8,653 a month may qualify.
 - Applicants should always complete the <u>Health First</u> <u>Colorado application</u> to find out if their income qualifies.



Financial Eligibility

- Applicant's income must be less than three times (300%) of the current Supplemental Security Income (SSI) limit
- May be a combination of different types of income such as SSI, SSDI, Social Security Survival benefits, child support, or income from a trust or employment
- The individual resource limit is \$2,00

NOTE: All HOUSEHOLD INCOME

Level of Care

- Hospital Level of Care
 - Participant's needs are similar to that of a person in a hospital. They have acute care needs or their condition in unstable and unpredictable.
- Nursing Facility Level of Care

Participant's needs are similar to that of a person in a nursing facility. They require regular medical care, in home services at least once every 30 days, and oversight of a physician to maintain stability.

 Intermediate Care Facility for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities (ICF-IID) Level of Care

Participant's needs are similar to that of a person in an ICF-IID facility.

They require regular medical care and rehabilitation.

Targeting Criteria

Includes:

- Age Range
- Diagnoses
- > Injuries

Example:

Brain Injury Waiver participants must: • be 16 years old or older

- · Living with a diagnosed brain injury
- Sustained that injury prior to age 65

- Participants may qualify for multiple HCBS waivers
- •Case managers must be familiar with all waivers to best inform participants of all of their options
- Participants and families select option that works best for them



Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Waivers

- Alternative to institutional care
 Provide institutional level of care to individuals who prefer to live in their home or community
- Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Waivers allow states flexibility to:
- · Waive certain income/eligibility criteria
- Provide specific services to target groups
- · or geographic regions
- · Can have waiting lists or enrollment caps

Can provide individuals more choice and independence

Step by Step Procedure

- 1. Contact your CCB* or Case Management Agency
- 2. 100.2 ULTC assessment
- 3. Paperwork & Eligibility
- 4. Approval or Denial in mail
- 5. Appeals Procedure



*Community Centered Board

Medicaid Waivers Home and Community Based (HCBS)

- Contact your county Social Services office, Single Entry Point Agency or your Community Centered Board
- Get a denial from Social Security (only for Children's HCBS Waiver)
- Complete a home visit to complete ULTC 100.2 (eligibility)
- Medicaid is secondary payer to private insurance
- There are different waivers for different populations



Case Management Agencies

24 Single Entry Point Agencies (SEP)
 Provides case management for BI, CLLI, CMHS, EBD, SCI waivers

Some SEPs provide case management for CHCBS waiver

- 20 Community Centered Boards (CCB)
 Provides case management for CES, CHRP, DD, SLS waivers
 - Some CCBs provide case management for CHCBS waiver
- 4 Private Case Management Agencies
 Provides case management for CHCBS waiver

Children's HCBS Criteria

- For medically fragile children who would otherwise be ineligible for Health First Colorado (Colorado's Medicaid Program) due to parental income and/or resources exceeding limit
- Must be ages birth 17 years old and meet hospital or nursing facility level of care
- Contact local Case Management Agency

CES Criteria

Children's Extensive Support Waiver (CES)

- For children with a developmental disability and intensive behavioral or medical needs
- Must be ages birth 17 years old and meet Intermediate Care Facility for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities (ICF-IID) level of care
- Contact local Community Centered Board (CCB)

CHRP Criteria

Children's Habilitation Residential Program (CHRP)

- For children and youth with a developmental disability and very high needs that put them at risk of or in need of, out of home placement
- Must be ages birth 20 years old and meet ICF-IID level of care
- Contact local Community Centered Board



Provide participants and families a decision-tree to help them understand all of the program options





- · Simple things like medication lists help.






Single Entry Point Agencies (SEP)
