# What's the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)?

A federal law that supports special education by...

- 1 Ensuring students aged 3-21 have the right to a free appropriate public education (**FAPE**) AND
- Ensuring students learn in the typical classroom or least restrictive environment (**LRE**) as much as possible

# What is Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act (Section 504)?



A federal law ensuring children and adults have the right to equal access to education, employment, health care and community services

2 Applies to any
entity/organization/agency that
recieves federal funding

# TIME SPANS OF PROTECTIONS

#### $1.IDEA \rightarrow$

- birth to three years old
- three years old to end of schooling the end of school is when one exits from school, graduates with a regular diploma, or ages out at 21 years old

#### 2. SECTION 504→

protects the individual throughout their lifetime



# WHEN SHOULD SCHOOLS CONSIDER EVALUATING A STUDENT? IDEA SECTION 504

Student has been diagnosed with a specific disabling condition

Student returns to school after a serious illness, or exhibits a chronic health condition or is diagnosed with a disabling condition

# DEFINITION OF DISABILITY

#### **IDEA**

- 1. Autism
- 2. Deaf-Blindness
- 3. Deafness
- 4. Emotional disturbance
- 5. Hearing impairment
- 6. Intellectual disability
- 7. Multiple disabilities
- 8. Orthopedic/other health impairment
- 9. Specific learning disability
- 10. Speech or language impairment
- 11. Traumatic brain injury
- 12. Visual impairment, including blindness
- 13. Developmental delay (for ages three-eight)

#### SECTION 504

A physical/mental impairment that substantially limits a major life activity (breathing, walking, reading, talking, +)

Record of impairment

Regarded as having impairment

# Specialized vs. Comparable

IDEA  $\rightarrow$  students are placed in the least restrictive environment

(LRE) to the maximum extent possible with appropriate supports and received specialized instruction

**Section 504**  $\rightarrow$  students are to receive services comparable to those provided to students without disabilities.

BOTH → Students eligible under IDEA will almost always enjoy protection under 504, but students eligible under 504 do not always qualify for protection under the more narrow categories listed under the IDEA



### DISTRICT OBLIGATIONS FOR IDEA AND SECTION 504

#### **CHILD FIND**




Requires that schools locate, identify, examine, and notify students with disabilities and their families of district obligations

- Eligibility Meeting




# NOTIFICATION


#### IDEA and SECTION 504

School must provide notice **in writing** to parent/guardian of intent to evaluate child.

Written consent from parent/guardian must be provided.



# IDEA EVALUATION



# Child is assessed in all areas related to the suspected disability which could include...

- Cognitive
- Communicative
- Educational
- Social/Emotional
- PhysicalHealth/Motor
   Development
- Vision and Hearing Screening

# SECTION 504 EVALUATION



Evaluation should accurately and completely assess the nature and extent of the disability.

Review of private medical/psychiatric records, private evaluation, school records including discipline, attendance, teacher observations

Can include comprehensive testing



• District staff is obligated to provide the services, accommodations and/or modifications described within the document.

# WHAT DOES A PLAN ENTAIL? IDEA SECTION 504

- Individualized Education
   Program (IEP)
- The IEP team must determine if the student remains eligible for special education services every three years.

- Plan and services are reviewed periodically (annual basis)
- Changes are documented
- If the plan is to be terminated, parents are notified and documentation is provided



Both → copies of the IEP/504 Plan are provided to parent and appropriate school and district staff

### $IDEA \longrightarrow IEP$

- Special education and related services
- Least restirctive environment (LRE)
- Goals

### SECTION 504 PLAN

Services and supplementary aids



**BOTH**  $\rightarrow$  include accommodations, modifications, and define the offer of a free appropriate public education (**FAPE**)

# WHAT ARE ACCOMODATIONS?

Changes in how a student accesses and demonstrates learning..

For example → extended testing time, preferential seating, assistive technology.

# WHAT ARE MODIFICATIONS?

Changes in what a student is expected to learn and demonstrate.

For example → changes in instructional level, content, and performance criteria.

### FREE APPRORPRIATE PUBLIC EDUCATION

#### **IDEA**

#### SECTION 504

Special education and related services that...

- are provided at public expense (without charge).
- meet the standards of the state education agency.
- are provided in conformity with the **IEP**.

#### The right to...

- access education equally to that of nondisabled students.
- be educated with students without disabilities to the maximum extent appropriate with the use of supplementary aids/services.
- have the school district make accommodations to allow the student an opportunity to participate in school related activities.
